Project 2 | **Monogram and Stationery**


Introduction

I know that there are some lettering that can be refined and I am hoping to do that with the digital sketches that we have to do next week. I do like several of the sketches that I did above and know now where I can make improvements.

I like how there were some that I connected with my initials that made the lettering stand out a little more and some of the serifs that I used helped make the lettering seem to give it a little more character. I started with just two of my initials for about half the page when I realized I could add my third initial into the project and with that it made it feel a little more fun and I was able to be a little more creative. I think it was hard to use my initials because they dont seem to blend very well with the other letters. I think if I were to do this again I would use a different marker and maybe try for bolder lettering to give the lines more support but overall I am happy with how it turned out.

Process

I decided that I was going to keep the designs simple and try to relate simplicity with how the monograms go with the pages. I first decided make the layouts and then pick which monogram I should adapt to the page and the I would layout objects. I found the rectangle bar to be the best looking most of the time and then try to distort it so that it would blend well. I would then think of ways to make the monogram standout like a logo. Type was difficult to make go well with the rest of the page and I tried to avoid mixing close font together and so I decided that I would use serif font with sans serif and by doing so create some contrast.

What I learned...

I learned that it takes a good amount of time to design stationery and know what goes well together to create contrast and different emotions. I noticed that colors also help to make things, such as the monogram, stand out. I found it important to look at the typography of the monograms and use font related to it and also add font that compliments it in order to create the contrast that makes the letters stand out like hierarchy over others. I think if I were to do this project over I would play around with more effects and try out different colors but I am very pleased on how the green stationery went along with the last one.




