Some of the things that I liked with the layout of my booklet is that every page except the covers are different and even the cover pages will look different when I finish the booklet.





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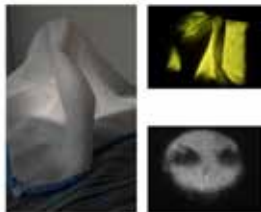


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STEP 2 | PET BOOKLET FINAL SUBMISSION
